THE WHEELBARROW LOAD

I'm writing this on a very rainy Sunday, which has thwarted my riding plans for the day. Not that I am complaining....with the extended drought we have had this summer, I will gratefully accept the rain whenever Mother Nature decides to favor us with it. Maybe another hay cutting will be possible after all, which might mean we can feed our beasts over the winter without taking out a second mortgage.

Fortunately I did manage to ride on Thursday this week, which is my day off (I work every Saturday, so I have to have some time to do all the things that normal people get accomplished on weekends). I have to plan my riding carefully and rarely get to do it more than twice a week, and often only manage once. Or none, if the weather doesn't cooperate.

I fully understand that riding, like any other sport, requires regular training in order to improve, or even to maintain, the desired skill level. Crystal used to say that any problem you have with your horse can be solved with wet saddle pads....her way of saying get on and ride, ride, ride. No excuses. Except that there are excuses, all the time, and things that interfere with everything I like to do. It's just, as they say, all part of being an adult.

I have made peace with the fact that at the age of sixty I am no longer aiming for the Olympics. I'm not really sure I have the guts or the stamina to get around a novice-level event course anymore. Schooling shows are still a possibility though, and clinics are an even likelier one. So I am thrilled that our club will be offering a dressage clinic in October with an instructor that I haven't yet had the opportunity to ride with, but who sounds from her bio like exactly the kind of clinician I need.

I think one of the best things about planning to ride in a clinic, or in a show, is the anticipation of the event. In my case the anticipation is always tempered by the fear that I will not be prepared, and that I will be subjected to ridicule and derision about my lack of ability. This feeling of potential doom and embarrassment pushes me to try harder than I normally would, and ride when maybe I would have made an excuse not to. The possibility of failure keeps me honest and riding more regularly, and that for me is the biggest reason to enter either a clinic or a show. I do enjoy riding for its own sake, but I am more consistent and try harder when I have a goal to achieve. I think that's the main reason piano teachers and ballet instructors have their students put on recitals. The looming deadline of performance keeps them on track.

So now I have a goal, and a plan, and I am looking forward to the Gwyneth McPherson clinic eagerly. She is a new face in our area, and if you take the time to read her bio and informational pages I think you will agree that she is a perfect fit for our club. It sounds like she will happily help you with whatever you are riding, whether it is a half-broke Quarter Horse or an upper-level schoolmaster.

Putting together a clinic is hard work, and I applaud our CDCTA Board for seeking out a new clinician and organizing the whole thing, and big thanks to Stacey Collier for hosting it at her barn and continuing the proud Stony Hill dressage tradition. I hope many of you can make space in your schedule for this exciting opportunity, and sign up for what promises to be an enlightening and novel experience! If you won't be able to ride, then consider auditing...it is a great way to learn without quite as much stress and logistics, and I'm sure you will take away a lot of knowledge that will help you as you ride at home, even on days when you might otherwise think about staying in your snuggly bed a little later in the morning, or chilling out in front of the TV instead of heading out to saddle your own mount-and rack up a few more wet saddle pads!



Gwyneth McPherson October 14 & 15, 2023 Columbia, MO

Gwyneth McPherson began her education in dressage in the late 1970s, riding in her backyard on an 11 hh pony. Her instructor introduced her to Lendon Gray (1980 and 1988 Olympian). Lendon mentored Gwyneth for 10 years. In 1984 Gwyneth achieved her first National Championship, and her Team and Individual Young Rider Gold Medals in 1987, under Lendon's guidance.

In 1990 Gwyneth began training with Carol Lavell (1992 Olympian). Carol further developed Gwyneth as an FEI rider and competitor. Gwyneth achieved a Team Bronze in 1991 and a Team Silver in 1992 in the North American Young Riders Championships, and trained her stallion G'Dur to do all the Grand Prix movements while riding with Carol.

In 2008, while employed as Head Trainer at Pineland Farms, Gwyneth began training with her two mentors' trainer Michael Poulin (Olympian 1992). Michael was trained by Franz Rochowansky (Chief Rider for the Spanish Riding School 1937-1955). Michael has shared much of Rochowansky's knowledge and wisdom with Gwyneth, completing her education as a Grand Prix rider, trainer and competitor.




