PLAY TILL YOU DIE...

I've been thinking a lot lately about the nature of play. As we put a few more pieces together in the puzzle that is Wolfie, it seems that his chief motivation for producing desired behavior is play.

It's no secret that all higher animals engage in forms of play. In fact, it may be one of the defining features OF a higher animal-do beetles play tag? Do snails play hide and seek? Play serves many functions, including preparing for adult behaviors, socialization and promotion of synaptic growth.

Certainly playfulness is much more prevalent in the youth of a species, but we are finding out more about how maintaining a playful (that is to say questing and imaginative) mindset helps us human beings slow down brain changes that occur as we age.

That was my defense of play, which I wanted to get out of the way first. Because you know what else playfulness is?

A GIGANTIC PAIN IN THE BUTT.

Toddlers stuff electronics down the toilet, dogs run through the sewage lagoons, and horses untie ropes and lead you a merry chase around the farm.

As difficult as these behaviors can be to deal with in the moment, they are all indications that the animal (or human!) in question is still alert and active and busy in their intellect. Too many people try to quash these behaviors because they are inconvenient, or time consuming, or just plain annoying. Certainly they can get out of hand, and some of the more dangerous ones need to be damped down, or changed into more positive, less risky ones, but they should not be eliminated entirely.

One of the many changes that have been wrought in my horsemanship over the last few months is the rediscovery of just how much fun it can be to hang out with your horse. As a kid I spent hours with my pony PeeWee, talking to him, taking him on treks to pick blackberries by the creek. So often as adults we are locked into tight schedules, trying to squeeze riding in before work, or after classes, or in between appointments. It is, I guess, better than not doing it at all, but not only does it present problems when trying to work through difficult lessons, it also makes us quickly blast through the things that build a relationship with your horse: grooming, watching him figure out a new challenge, letting him enjoy a pleasant hack through the woods after the lesson is done.

Rediscovering how much fun it is to actually play with a horse has been a revelation for me. I find myself looking more forward to playing with Wolfie, watching his reaction as we learn more about each other, and create a stronger bond. I love to ride, and I hope I will always be able to do so. But as I grow ever older and more brittle, it's comforting to know that my horses and I can continue to play and learn for the rest of our lives.

Directions: Take I-70 west to exit 121 at Midway. Go 4 miles on Hwy. 40 to Rte. J. Turn right on Rte. J and go 2 miles to Rocheport Gravel Road. Turn left, the farm is 1 1/2 miles down the road. Stay to the left at the T and curve back to right, farm is the on the right at top of the hill.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Except where otherwise noted, USEF/USDF and MHSA rules will apply.
2. The 2015 USDF Dressage tests will be used for classes 1-10. The 2014 USEA Eventing tests will be used for classes 1CT-4CT.
3. All tests to be ridden in plain snaffle.
4. First-place prize and ribbons through sixth place for all classes. High score rosettes given to the highest score earned in Introductory, Training, First, and Second level, and to the best overall score in the combined test. TIP AWARDS: The Jockey Club is once again providing us with special awards for TIP-registered Thoroughbreds. Highest scoring TIP registered Thoroughbred at the Intro Eventer level and at Training Level Dressage will each receive a lovely rosette and an embroidered dufflebag. If entries warrant awards may be given at other levels. Smaller prizes for Reserve High Score TIP! Information on registering your Thoroughbred can be found at the end of this showbill.
5. A negative Coggins test, dated within one year, must be submitted with entry or must accompany each horse arriving on the grounds EVEN IF YOUR HORSE IS STABLED ON THE PREMISES.
6. RIDE TIMES: Will be emailed to all entrants who provide email address, or call 573-356-3877 after 8 p.m. on September 15.
7. NO DOGS PLEASE.
8. Casual attire is appropriate, but breeches, boots, and hard hats are mandatory.

9. No stabling is available at Sunny Oak Farms.

10. No entries will be scheduled until check is in show manager's hands. Late entries will be accepted after closing date until show is full for an additional \$10 late fee. SHOW IS OUTDOORS AND PARKING IS IN A FIELD; HEAVY SUSTAINED RAINS PRIOR TO OR THE DAY OF THE SHOW WILL RESULT IN CANCELLATION. IF SHOW IS CANCELED, YOUR CHECK WILL BE RETURNED. IF SHOW IS CANCELED, SHOW MANAGER WILL NOTIFY ALL ENTRANTS BY CELL PHONE BEFORE 7 A.M. ON SEPTEMBER 17.

11. Lunch concessions will be available on-site.

A FRIENDLY REMINDER: Remember that the maximum number of tests a horse/rider combination may enter in a day is 3. .

NOTE NEW REFUND POLICY: Entries may be cancelled for any reason prior to midnight on closing date. Refund of all fees, less a \$10 office fee, will be mailed to you. AFTER MIDNIGHT ON CLOSING DATE NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON!!

PLEASE NOTE: CDCTA WILL CHARGE A \$10 FEE FOR CHECKS THAT ARE RETURNED FOR ANY REASON

For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by TJC. In order to participate in a T.I.P. class or be eligible for a T.I.P. award, owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

* To obtain a T.I.P. number, please go to <http://tjctip.com/default.asp?page=19>. There is no charge for a T.I.P. Number.

* You will need an Interactive Registration account in order to apply for a T.I.P. number. This is a free account which will also allow you to transact other business with The Jockey Club through our Interactive Registration (IR) system, www.registry.jockeyclub.com. If you do not have an IR account, please follow the prompts to sign up. Once you've gotten the account, you'll need to go back to www.tjctip.com to apply for the number. If you do have one, please login.

* Click "Apply for a T.I.P. Number"

* Follow the instructions. Only enter ONE of the search fields (Horse name, tattoo OR dam name/YOB). Please use the Search/Submit buttons and be sure to populate each field. Do not hit "enter" to go to the next step.

o If you do not know your horse's registered name or pedigree, you can use the link that says "If you need assistance with identification, please click here" and fill out the email form for assistance.

* Once you have completed the application, please print a T.I.P. Card using the button to the right and present this at horse shows for proof of eligibility.

CDCTA Meeting Minutes: August 15, 2016 @ Angelo's Pizza & Steakhouse

Meeting called to order at 19:32. In attendance: Rosy Erganian, Alice Fisher, Kim Kriekhaus, Lora Blair, Mary Frances Carrington, Leah Strid, Beth Hussey, Amy Stapleton, Karin Loftin, Karen Atwill, Candace Kassel, Tesa Sterchi, Sarah (Sally) Crawford, and Audrey Plummer.

Approval of Minutes: Motion to approve July minutes by Beth, seconded by Rosy, and carried.

Treasurer's Report: Amy reported she has not received the current bank statement yet, so the balance remains the same as July at \$8,230. Checks have been written and Amy purchased new checks, both of which will be reflected in the next reported account balance. Motion to approve by Beth, seconded by Rosy, and carried.

Committee Reports:

Communications: Thank you Beth for the excellent "Wheelbarrow Load" article! Leah reported the website is up-to-date with the fall show information – discussion over entry details. Leah also posted information on the website about carpooling to the USDF Convention.

Competitions: Discussion over the future of the Show-Me State Games Dressage show – the spring WWU dressage show reportedly lost money and had no CDCTA members entered; we should not feel obligated to attend shows, but we need to discuss if local competitions should be kept; CDCTA is not required as a GMO to put on any shows; Kim reported she has noticed a downturn in demand as a judge over the last few years; Mary Francis said most people she contacted had other engagements, etc.; question of whether or not the SMSG Dressage show could return in 2018 if not conducted in 2017; Beth mentioned the SMSG wants dressage because they need to put on a certain percentage of actual Olympic sports; Beth believes the existing format for the show is a problem and recommended the formation of a committee; Kim also suggested another GMO, such as SLADS, could potentially take over the SMSG show; suggestion to market to other GMOs in the state, as well as to trainers (offer an incentive); suggestion to possibly offer a Prix St. George jackpot, Rosy suggested presenting ribbons after each class to reduce the amount of time horses have to stand tied to trailers; stabling is an issue; Karen recommended looking into the state fairgrounds as a possible venue; discussion over dates. Beth motioned to continue the SMSG Dressage show in 2017, Tesa seconded, and the motion was carried. Kim elected to form a committee to oversee the Show-Me State Games Dressage show – Karin Loftin, Karen Atwill, Audrey Plummer, Mary Francis Carrington, and Tesa Sterchi volunteered for the committee, and Beth Hussey was appointed committee chairman. Mary Francis announced she would be stepping down as the SMSG show manager. Beth suggested hiring a show manager – discussion. Discussion over a new facility opening in Oak Grove as a possible SMSG venue. Beth will talk to the SMSG, and the issues discussed will be pursued further by the committee. Rosy reported she will need volunteers on Friday, September 16th for set-up of the dressage ring and Monday, September 19th for its tear-down. A scribe is also needed for the CDCTA Fall Dressage Schooling Show and Combined Test. Rosy called to confirm with the judge (JoAnne Bonnell). The fall show will offer dressage and combined training. Leah mentioned the last show she rode in that JoAnne Bonnell was the judge, there was time allotted for the judge to give remarks immediately after each test. Rosy said she may consider offering this if there are light entries – discussion. Amy mentioned she will have cupcakes at the show! Pony club may do the concessions for the fall show. Rosy reported the organizing of the show is going well.

Education: The Barbara Joyce clinic will now be on September 10th due to a weather delay. Leah will get the information up on the website. Lora said the picnic at Fox Run in June was too hot to spend much time doing the educational aspect. The Pilates for Dressage Clinic with Janice Dulak was rescheduled to November 11th-13th. Lora asked if there was anything those in attendance would be interested in. Beth suggested carpooling to the AWS Inspection and Sport Horse Breeding Seminar on September 25th. Discussion – should be very educational and welcoming; Leah will put up information on the website; Kim offered to be the contact for carpooling. Karin mentioned Melissa Allen may be willing to do a clinic. Discussion – requires 8-10 riders; would charge \$1,000 per day for a 3-day format; has dates available for spring 2017; willing to stay with someone; Karin will look into further. Lora reported the Greg Best clinics will no longer occur, so she suggested putting together a new clinic, possibly as a "teach and test" format. Discussion – would require fewer people; one-day vs. two-day format; stabling issues at Fox Run; would cost \$100 per stall for the weekend if Lora rents temporary stalls. Jana Wagner will be doing a clinic at Stony Hill the weekend of August 20th.

Old Business: Kim volunteered to be the CDCTA delegate for the USDF Convention. Discussion over costs – pre-registration is cheaper. Email Leah if interested in carpooling.

New Business: Need to start thinking about officer nominations. Kim nominated Leah Strid for President.

Next Meeting: Beth suggested the AWS Inspection/Seminar on September 25th at Trinita Farms in Labadie, MO as an educational meeting. Time TBD.

Motion to adjourn meeting by Beth and seconded by Rosy at 20:32.

Directions:

Take Interstate 70 East to the Highway 40-64 exit to Chesterfield/St. Louis. Catch the very first exit just past the Missouri River Bridge in Chesterfield. You will see the Blue Valley Outlet Mall on your right. It is the Long Road exit.

At the first intersection take a right on to Olive Street Road. Olive turns into North Eatherton. Before you cross a railroad track you will take a right onto Centaur Road. Take Centaur all the way the end. You will cross the railroad track on Centaur. At the end of Centaur there is a three way stop sign. Go right at the stop sign. You will then be on Wildhorse Creek Road. Stay on Wildhorse Creek Road for about three miles until you come to a fork in the road. Stay RIGHT and travel onto Ossenfort Road. Stay right on Ossenfort and travel up a very narrow hill until you reach a 4-way stop sign. This will be Highway T. Go right onto T and pass St. Albans Country Club. There will be two entrances to the Club on your right, about a mile apart from one another. Check your odometer as you pass the SECOND St. Albans exit.

Two miles past this point you will come to Fiddle Creek Road on our left. You can only go left. Go left onto Fiddle Creek and we are about 3/4 of a mile down on the right. Look for a black mailbox on a blue post.
